Held on Thursday 7th August at 4.45pm, entry is included in a full conference pass, and additional tickets can be purchased separately.





Adventure

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Hidden Termite Damage: A Costly Oversight That Ended in a \$67,500 Settlement

Buying a home is one of the biggest financial decisions Australians make. That's why pre-purchase inspections matter — they help buyers avoid hidden problems. But what if something critical gets missed?

The missed red flag A buyer hired a building inspector to carry out a pre-purchase inspection, following Australian Standard AS4349. The goal: spot any major or minor defects, safety issues, or termite damage.

The inspector flagged several problems, including some major ones, but reported no sign of termites or structural damage. But months after the report, the tenant noticed a sagging beam in the lounge—and raised the alarm.

Confirming the damage

A different timber pest specialist was called in and confirmed the worst: termites were attacking a key support beam. The property owner faced major expenses to have the beam repaired. The tenant also had to vacate during this time. While this was already severe, it would have been even more serious if the beam had fallen and injured the tenant.

So, should the original inspector have picked this up?

Looking back, some clear signs were missed:

Sagging beam: The inspector had taken a photo of the beam, which already showed deflection, but dismissed it as cosmetic as the house was already in disrepair.

Tenant's warning ignored: The tenant mentioned past termite issues during the inspection — but this wasn't recorded or followed up on.

Financial and legal consequences

Repairing the termite damage was urgent and expensive. The beam was replaced, the tenant had to move out, and the owner lost rental income. Total costs were around \$110,000.

The owner blamed the inspector for missing obvious clues and took legal action. The case was passed to the inspector's insurer, Rapid Solutions.

Settlement and expert findings Rapid Solutions brought in lawyers and an independent expert to assess the situation.

They found that the inspector should have:

- Treated the sagging beam as a major structural issue and safety concern.
- Recommended a structural engineer.
- Suggested the buyer ask about the property's termite history.

Noted external signs — like termite damage in a backyard tree — and advised further internal inspection.

The claim was settled for \$67,500. With legal costs added, the total payout came to \$112,818.

Telling a complete risk story

This case is a strong reminder for all inspectors that good inspection reports don't just list what's wrong now—they warn about what could go wrong.

Reports are usually on the condition of the house at time of inspection—but this needs to be flipped. Reports should also mention the risks associated with the property, including what you can't see.

This is especially important when it comes to termite inspections. Inspectors should not only report on current damage, but how conducive the property is to a termite infestation.

And, as this below checklist shows—most properties are high risk:

- The home has no current termite management system
- There are high moisture readings, leaks or service overflows
- There are timbers in contact with the ground (and thus a food source)

- There are trees within 50m of the building
- The house has a roof and/or a subfloor
- The house has been renovated or needs renovating
- The home mentioned in the above case study obviously had at least a few of these indicators. If the report had noted these, along with actionable recommendations for the buyer, a claim could have been avoided.

Report writing tips

As a pest manager, you can take immediate steps to improve how you report and lessen the likelihood of facing a stressful legal claim.

Firstly, be sure to include clear, actionable recommendations tailored to each property:

Don't dismiss structural signs: A sagging beam is a red flag. Always note it and recommend further investigations.

Listen to the people on-site: Tenants and vendors may share important details. Record and act on them.

When in doubt, escalate:

Recommending further checks by relevant professionals makes your report more valuable to your customer and puts the responsibility for next steps in their hands.

Look for hidden issues: Termites and structural damage aren't always obvious — but with care and thoroughness in your inspection, they're rarely invisible.

Get visual evidence

Secondly, take photographs. Clear photos are one of the best ways to show risks and protect yourself from complaints. Take pictures of any defects you see, areas you couldn't access, and results from tools like moisture meters — even if the readings look normal. The more detail you include, the more helpful and reliable your report will be.

In fact, taking photographs (video is even better) of all areas at the property is also the best evidence for what wasn't visible at the time of your inspection.

Using a reporting tool can make this easier. A simple, cloud-based system that can help you write clear, consistent reports that meet industry standards. It lets you quickly record your findings, include photos, and create professional reports — saving time and giving you confidence that nothing's been missed.





This ensures a thoughtful, skills-based match with a mentor who can best support their development.

Mentorships will typically last 3 to 6 months with regular check-ins (monthly or fortnightly). Each pair will define their preferred structure and touchpoints early on, ensuring clarity and mutual expectations.

AEPMA is currently confirming the extent of insurance coverage for mentors acting under the program name — particularly for professional indemnity and public liability. All participants must sign a waiver with robust indemnity and confidentiality clauses.

BuildSkills Australia Launches Urban Pest Management Review to Modernise Industry Training

This national review aims to update the Certificate III and IV in Urban Pest Management to ensure they are fit for purpose, aligning training outcomes with the real-world demands of modern pest control. The process will involve extensive stakeholder consultation and expert oversight, ensuring the revised training package supports regulatory compliance, industry professionalism, and future workforce capability.

BuildSkills Australia has initiated a comprehensive review of the Urban Pest Management training qualifications in response to evolving industry practices and emerging skill demands. This initiative aims to ensure that pest management professionals are equipped with the knowledge and competencies required to meet modern challenges in urban environments.

Why the Review?

The current qualifications Certificate III (CPP30119) and Certificate IV (CPP41619) in Urban Pest Management are no longer fully aligned with the realities of the industry. Advances in pest control technologies, regulatory changes, and shifting environmental concerns have created a gap between existing training and actual job requirements.

Project Scope and Timeline

The review will involve a full revision of the training products, including qualifications and units of competency. The process is structured into several key phases:

Initial Development: Review of existing qualifications and identification of gaps.

Technical Committee Formation: A panel of industry experts has been formed to oversee the review, with the first meeting set for June 2025.

The Technical Committee includes representatives from AEPMA member firms (small, medium, and large), RTOs, State Licensing bodies, and pest management consultants. Committee members are:

- Tracey Eyles (Scorpion Pest Management - TAS)
- Emma Mendelsohn (Noahs Ark Pest Control - VIC)

- Trent Chapman (Local Pest Experts NSW)
- Sarah Cutting (Spiderman SE Eco Pest Management – SA)
- Thomas Overby (Rentokil Australia National)
- John Murray (Flick Anticimex Pty Ltd National)
- Bruce Dekker (CQ Protrain)
- Gary Cochrane (MPL Training Pty Ltd)
- Kerrie Undery (Rapid Training)
- Fiona Sheppard (PEST Australia)
- Raja Mahendran (International Pest Business Consultant)
- Brendan Gorrie (Department of Health Victoria)

Drafting and Consultation: A draft of the revised training products will be released in October 2025 for public feedback. This will include two rounds of online consultations. Finalisation: Based on feedback, revisions will be made, and the final draft will be submitted to relevant authorities in January 2026.

Implementation: The new training products are expected to be rolled out starting May 2026.

The project dates listed above may be altered as the review progresses.

Stakeholder Engagement

BuildSkills has developed a robust consultation strategy to ensure broad industry input. This includes:

- · In-person and virtual meetings
- Online surveys
- Focus groups and workshops
- Public feedback via the BuildSkills website and email

This inclusive approach is designed to produce fit-for-purpose qualifications, ensuring that graduates are job-ready and capable of meeting the industry's evolving needs.

Industry Impact

The review is expected to have a significant impact on the pest management sector by:

- Enhancing the professionalism of the workforce
- Aligning training with current and future technologies
- Supporting regulatory compliance and environmental sustainability
- Improving public health outcomes through better pest control practices

As an industry-led initiative, the redevelopment of our training package will require contributions from all stakeholders, including Professional Pest Managers, RTOs, Suppliers, and Manufacturers. AEPMA encourages everyone to participate and contribute to this review.




Figure 1 outlines the Training Product Development Process Map

AEPMA's Codes of Best Practice – Free to Download, Backed by Training

This article, written by Gary Stephenson, outlines the AEPMA **Industry Codes of Best Practice, which** play a key role in setting professional standards across the Australian pest management industry. Developed through extensive consultation with subject matter experts, the codes provide pest managers with a clear and practical framework for delivering highquality, consistent, and ethical services. The codes are freely available to download on the AEPMA website, and accreditation training is available for each code, offering pest managers the opportunity to strengthen their skills and demonstrate their commitment to best practice.

The Australian Environmental Pest Management Association (AEPMA) is the professional pest management industry's peak national body, and as such, is committed to promoting a culture of professionalism and innovation not only in the pest management industry but also in allied and associated industries such as building and construction.

It is probably common knowledge that the AEPMA have been working on a suite of industry codes of best practice. The Codes of Best Practice have been developed, in large part, to' lift the bar' for the level of quality and professionalism which our industry can aspire.

The ACCC (Australian Consumer & Competition Commission) have granted formal approval & authorisation of the two termite management codes:

AEPMA Industry Code of Best Practice for Termite Management

AEPMA Industry Code of Best Practice for Termite Management during construction

The ACCC recognised that by abiding by the standards set out in the Codes, pest managers who chose to be bound by the codes were also required to meet specific levels of practical experience, skills and ongoing training in termite management practices in order to become signatories to the Codes.

The two termite codes have recently been reviewed and updated. They are available free on the AEPMA website to interested parties including pest managers, builders and other stakeholders like property managers, strata bodies, business owners, developers and homeowners, all of which constitute our customers.

The AEPMA is pleased to announce accreditation programs available for several of the codes and has previously written to all members asking if they

would become signatories to these new Codes.

Point of Difference

The Codes are voluntary and any pest managers (member or non-member) who sign up to them will have a valuable point of difference with which to market their business.

The development of the codes has been an extensive, tedious, and consultative process, involving several highly experienced and knowledgeable subject matter experts with diverse backgrounds and contrasting insights. This has resulted in reference documents which represent Best Practice. This is in stark contrast to other guidelines or standards which advocate minimum acceptable standards, albeit, that have served us reasonably well up to this point.

Code Accreditation

AEPMA is pleased to offer Certified Accreditation Programs that underpin the industry codes of best practice. This currently applies to the two 'Termite Management' codes and the 'Pest Management in the Food Industry' code, with training for other codes under development. Signatory Accreditation involves the successful completion of a dedicated Online Training Course and Assessment for each code as required.

The Accreditation Training is now a condition for the issue of certificates that will be issued to each signatory after completion of each successful training course.

Renewal of certificates and retraining is envisaged every 5 years to coincide with code reviews and updates.

The advantages of signing onto the codes are many and varied, but obvious benefits include:

Being guided by more prescriptive reference documents which pest managers can use as an instruction manual or benchmark for setting up and delivering an array of structured, professional services to their clients and which they can use to measure what they're currently doing and how they're doing it against.

The Codes are voluntary and freely available to any pest manager (member or non-member).
The codes are freely available to all other stakeholders.

Sets out Industry Standards of Conduct.

Sets out guidelines for fair dealing between pest managers and their clients and outlines what a client can expect from a pest management company when he or she agrees to engage its services.

Provides a clear and transparent dispute resolution process for pest managers and their clients.

Code signatory Pest Managers who become accredited and commit to undertake work compliant with the Codes of Best Practice will also be listed on the AEPMA website under the appropriate code signatory registers and will be able to promote their businesses and services with the accreditation certification and logos.

The AEPMA Industry Codes of Best Practice are available to download free of charge from the AEPMA website.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment Subject: Eligibility of Specialised Directors for Executive Office

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following amendment to the Constitution of AEPMA:

Insert New Clause after Article 54 - Composition of the National Board 54A. Appointment of Directors with Special Qualifications

The National Board may appoint up to two (2) additional directors who possess special qualifications relevant to the pest management industry. These qualifications may include, but are not limited to, scientific, regulatory, technical, or commercial expertise that advances the objectives of the Association.

Directors appointed under this clause:

- Shall have full voting rights.
- Are not considered representatives of any particular Branch Council, regardless of their state of residence or employment.
- Must demonstrate a commitment to national representation and shall not act solely in the interest of any one state or region.

Amend Article 56 - Election of Officers 56. Election of Officers

The directors shall, from their number, elect a President, Vice-President, and Treasurer.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Constitution, a director appointed under Article 54A shall be eligible for election to the office of President or Vice-President only if:

- They are also a Professional Member of the Association; and
- They are a qualified pest manager in accordance with licensing and certification requirements recognised by the Association.

At any given time, no more than one (1) director appointed under Article 54A may hold an executive office.

Insert New Definition into Article 2 – Interpretation and Definitions "Qualified pest manager" means an individual who holds a current licence or authorisation under relevant state or territory legislation to carry out pest control activities and who satisfies the criteria for a Professional Member of the Association.

 Special Resolution at AGM: Clarifying Executive Eligibility for Specialised Directors AEPMA Members to Vote on Constitutional Change – 6 August 2025

AEPMA's Annual General Meeting will be held at 4:30pm on Wednesday 6 August 2025 at the Adelaide Convention Centre, during the Pesticon Conference.

Among the key items of business is a proposed constitutional amendment that aims to clarify the role of Specialised Directors—specifically, their eligibility to hold the offices of President or Vice-President of the Association.

What's Being Proposed?

The AEPMA Constitution already allows the National Board to appoint up to two Specialised Directors (also called Directors with Special Qualifications). These individuals bring targeted experience—such as regulatory knowledge, technical skill, scientific background or commercial insight—to help strengthen the Board's capability.

The proposed amendment:

Formally introduces Article 54A, which reaffirms the Board's ability to appoint up to two Specialised Directors;

Confirms that these directors have full voting rights but do not represent a Branch;

Requires them to act in the national interest, not that of a specific state.

More significantly, the change proposes a replacement of Article 56 to confirm that a Specialised Director may only be elected President or Vice-President if they:

Are a Professional Member of AEPMA; and

Are a qualified pest manager, meaning they hold a current pest management licence under relevant legislation.

To maintain representative balance, the change limits the number of Specialised Directors in executive office to one at any given time.

A new definition of "qualified pest manager" will also be inserted into Article 2 to support this clause.

Why It Matters

This change doesn't create a new category of director—it simply clarifies leadership eligibility, protecting the democratic structure of AEPMA's governance while acknowledging the value of specialist expertise.

It ensures that those who lead the Association not only bring deep knowledge but also uphold the professional standards expected by members and regulators alike.



"I was only going to do five years in the pest industry... 28 years later, I'm still here and more passionate than ever."



"I was only going to do five years in the pest industry". Famous last words, 28 years later I am still in the industry. I started my career with a franchise in Mount Isa in Western QLD, my intention at the time was to complete my five years and then do something else. I had no previous experience in pest management and no sales experience. This was a steep learning curve, and I found that I enjoyed the learning and also building relationships with people.

In 2003 I moved to Toowoomba with my young family and I initially worked for another pest control company for approximately 16 months. In 2015, we established CDI Pest Management, working out of the backroom of home in Toowoomba.

Over the years we slowly grew our business mainly through word of mouth and began working in Brisbane as well as across the Darling Downs. December 2015 marked a change for us as we purchased Prestige Pest Control in Ashgrove. This established an office in Brisbane from which we could conduct our operations.

Operating 2 branches meant that our team had to expand and systemize. Along with technology such as cloud based computing and VoIP phones this allowed us to operate both areas seamlessly. At the same time we became ISO 9001 Quality Management System certified and HACCP accredited.

New South Wales

An AEPMA NSW ACT Branch meeting was held on zoom on the 12 May 2025 at 3.30 pm. The meeting was well attended with 10 present and a few apologies.

Chairperson Patrick Legey welcomed all in attendance

After discussing the minutes of the previous meeting, we moved onto other matters of business which included the 2025 AEPMA conference "Adapt & Thrive: Navigating Changes in Pest Management" in Adelaide 6-8 August 2025. Most of the State Council delegates present mentioned they were going to the conference, and we encourage all members to attend.

The team discussed various topics including the progress of different initiatives, and the challenges we face in Pest Management. We discussed the ban on glue boards in certain states, the updates on termite codes of practice, the potential merger of PMITAG with the national Training and Delivery Task Force, business mentoring program implementation on the website, including both individual mentoring and business-to-business.

Eris Hess further elaborated on the ban on glue boards in New South Wales, Victoria, and Tasmania, citing animal cruelty as the reason. The ban has been met with resistance, with the Department of Primary Industries seeking scientific evidence to justify the ban. Eris and others are seeking evidence from pest control companies and customers who use glue boards as a last line of defence. Gary Stephenson suggested that the food industry could potentially lobby for the use of glue boards, but the lack of a recent mouse

plague has hindered their efforts. The team is also considering exemptions for pest control.

It proposed to ask the National Board about adding pest control licenses process, requirements per state, and contacts on the AEPMA careers website. It was great that after 18 months of strong advocacy, AEPMA NSW has successfully negotiated a 12-week "probation period" or "grace period" with EPA NSW before mandatory enrolment of a trainee into a Pest Management course with an RTO.

Until now, businesses were required to enrol new trainees with a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) from Day 1 just to secure an EPA trainee permit—costly and risky, especially if the new hire turned out to be unsuitable. That's now changed.

You will still need to apply for an EPA trainee permit immediately—but now you'll have a 12-week window to finalise the trainee's RTO enrolment. Early enrolment remains an option, but after 12 weeks, EPA will require evidence or an explanation.

Not registering for the permit or enrolling with an RTO within the timeframe will impact the trainee's ability to obtain a full licence and may result in penalties.

We are still waiting for further clarification from EPA NSW.

A great achievement by the AEPMA Branch State Council for the benefit of the NSW Pest Management Industry (members and non-members). The group discussed the need for better communication about training permit requirements, suggesting that EPA should notify license holders and businesses. They also propose adding information about obtaining licenses and permits to the AEPMA website and magazine.

It was decided at the meeting of the 12 May to ask EPA to develop an information flyer or fact sheet.

to outline training permit requirements and responsibilities.

AEPMA NSW will offer to provide help if required.

Given the pending review of the Pesticides Regulation 2017 later this year or early in 2026,

AEPMA will work closely with EPA to ensure a Fair go for the NSW Pest Management Industry.

We have supplied EPA with evidence of a trainee operating in NSW for six months while applying pesticides without a permit. This is being investigated by EPA inspectors. If you are aware of people doing the wrong thing and can provide evidence, please get in touch with us and we will make sure the information goes to the right place.

As usual, we discussed the Review of the Industry Codes of Best Practice and Training to the Codes (which included Subterranean Termite Management (can be seen on AEPMA website), the lack of qualifications for Pre-Purchase Timber Pest Inspectors, Field Biologist Course, Pest Management as a Trade and what it means for the Industry, BuildSkills Australia's Review of the Pest Management Training Package, traineeships, Insurance claims and much more.

The next meeting will be on zoom on Monday 14 July 2025 at 3.30pm.

It's been a busy few months for the AEPMA Victoria Branch. We've had the opportunity to contribute to several training advisory groups, helping guide future outcomes for the industry.

A major review of pest management training is now underway, led by BuildSkills—appointed by the Federal Government. Working closely with key stakeholders, this review aims to modernise our training units and create a framework that reflects the current and future needs of the industry. The process is expected to take about a year, with periodic opportunities for industry-wide feedback.

At the same time, the Victorian Skills Authority is conducting a broader review to help build the state's trade workforce. This includes exploring pathways to introduce pest control training into the VET system at the secondary school level —an initiative that could help spark early interest in the profession.

This is a pivotal moment. We have a real chance to influence how the next generation of pest professionals are trained and supported.

The Vic Branch holds quarterly meetings in a hybrid format. Our next meeting is scheduled for July (details TBC), and prospective members are welcome to attend.
